<b>A+</b>	Gender-neutral option, no provider certification required (20 states + DC)	Arkansas, California, Colorado*, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Hawai'i, Illinois**, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, Virginia, Washington
<b>A</b>	No provider certification required, no gender neutral option (1 state)	Michigan
<b>A-</b>	Gender-neutral option, provider certification required (1 state)	New Hampshire
<b>B+</b>	Easy-to-understand form, certification from a range of licensed professionals (7 states + 1 territory)	Alaska, Delaware, Missouri, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Puerto Rico, Wyoming
<b>B</b>	Easy-to-understand form, certification by a limited range of licensed professionals (3 states)	Indiana, Nebraska, West Virginia
<b>C+</b>	No form, no requirement of proof of surgery or court order; certification from medical/mental health professional (5 states)	Arizona, Florida, Idaho, Kansas, Wisconsin
<b>C</b>	Burdensome process requirements but does not require proof of surgery, court order, or amended birth certificate (1 states)	Utah (must provide an updated passport or birth certificate; has a gender-neutral option)
<b>D</b>	Unclear, unknown, or unwritten policy (4 states + 2 territories)	Alabama, American Samoa, Mississippi, Montana, South Dakota
<b>F</b>	Proof of surgery, court order, or amended birth certificate required (8 states + 2 territories)	Georgia, Guam, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Northern Mariana Islands, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas

\* Colorado requires a provider certification for minors only.

\*\*Illinois has announced it will be issuing X designations, but they are not yet available.
